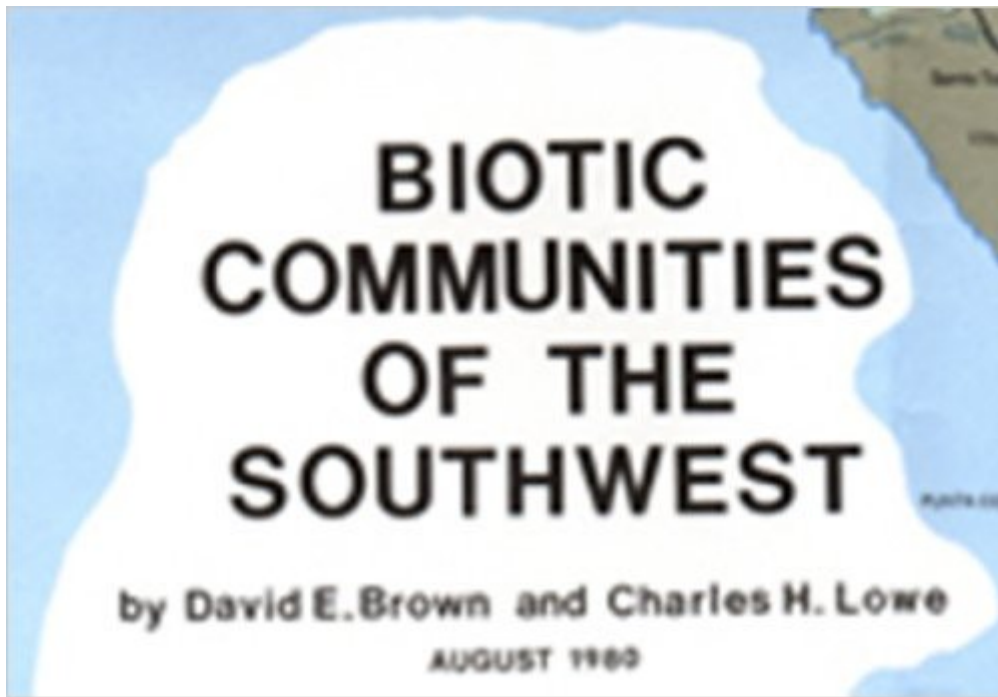

Might need to return this... It is enormous, which wouldn't be a problem if this were a multi-purpose map. For example, I would want the color overlays to be transparent so one could see elevation. That's huge for anyone studying biotic communities. But it's also huge for a big map. My house is small and while I would love a large map that covers my wall, if it does it needs to address multiple needs. When looking at a map I'm trying to learn about where I'm at. Elevation change is huge and very highly correlated with biotic communities...so it's very hard for me to look at a map that doesn't include that. Unless I want to spend the time drawing mountain ranges on this map it's pretty useless to me... I would learn a lot doing that but unfortunately time and energy are in short supply around here.. I really wanted to like this because I respect David Brown's work. Darn it!

"Biotic Communities of the Southwest" is a superb cartographical effort - if you have a wall this large. But it is out of date in two senses. First, the map was published in 1980. Thirty years in the southwest is a LONG time (see "The Changing Mile" by Turner, Webb, Bowers, and Hastings). The map is still a good approximation, but one must use it with caution. Second, you need a big, blank wall or a large table to use it. Even though it is dated, it could be reprinted at one quarter its size and

still be useful as a wall map. It should absolutely be on a CD to be opened in a graphic format of one sort or another - PDF would be fine.

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
